The following criteria* must be met and validated by the Ski Patrol Director no later than Dec. 1st in order to patrol.

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| | Have winter wilderness experience, map & compass, fire-starting, bivouac skills. Be able to ski or snowshoe miles of steep/deep snow in harsh winter weather. Have proper winter clothing and gear (as outlined in Ski Patrol Required Gear Checklist). Have adequate transportation to the MTTA Snoparks. (4 wheel drive, AWD, chains or traction devices). Purchase and properly display valid Snopark permit (winter) and Discover Pass (summer) if driving. Pay annual MTTA membership dues of \$25 (or be part of a \$35 family membership). * Attend Ski Patrol Training (3 rd Sat. in July or Sept) for 3 consecutive years. * Participate in at least one official work project annually (2 nd Sat. June—Oct) or arrange a project w/WP Coord.* Have a valid 1 st Aid/CPR card (limited classes through MTTA). Provide current certification every 2 years. * Complete an Avalanche Awareness class (one time. Online tutorial available).* Accompany a veteran patroller on first mentor patrol to a hut (if a patroller is available). Patrol a minimum of 4 times; once each month Jan — March and once in Dec. or April. Work in the MTTA office at least once, mid-Dec mid-April. Will find a trained replacement if unable to. Do chores at huts (clean, shovel stairs, fill snow buckets/water filters, restock TP/towels, etc.) Be responsible for MTTA key at all times (pay \$10 replacement fee if lost and return if no longer patrolling). Always carry a pack with the 10 essentials and an MTTA radio (turned on). Leave children/pets home while on patrol unless another adult is able to supervise them. Pets must stay outside. |

| | Behave in an ethical, professional manner, so as not to jeopardize MTTA's reputation or create a liability. Treat everyone in a respectful manner, exhibit exemplary behavior, and be a positive role model. Honor MTTA rules and not abuse Ski Patrol privileges (Ski Patrol bunks, keys, access, etc). Work cooperatively and communicate with other patrollers (in person or via radio). Respect other's privacy and not divulge sensitive or confidential information. Seek advice from Leadership and notify them with concerns or problems. Know and carry out Ski Patrol duties and hut chores each time I patrol. Safeguard key, door codes, and always lock padlocks and gates. Not use bad language or negative actions while on patrol or around the public. Not use alcohol while patrolling (may use after-hours, but will remain competant to respond to emergencies). Not use illegal drugs at any time. |
